Session I Maker Mania Part 3

Join us for an exciting journey of hands-on learning and fun at our Makerspace-themed summer camp. Children will learn to use three different types of software as they explore 3-D printing, vinyl cutting, and Laser Etching. Using the Cricut children will create their own custom tie-dye t-shirts, create their own custom night light, and will make their own reusable shopping bag to hold their creations. Using an Ortur laser children will etch a portrait of themselves, create a unique book mark, and a cool dog tag necklace. Finally, children will learn how to use Tinkercad to 3-D print various fun projects each day.

Session 2 Ultimate Sports Adventure Camp

Join us for an action-packed week at the Ultimate Sports Adventure Camp! This camp is perfect for young athletes, offering a dynamic blend of classic sports, team-building games, and exciting activities. Each day children will learn a new skill and practice the fundamentals that will allow them to participate in an exciting whole group activity. Children will learn teamwork, healthy exercise habits, and have fun. Children Grades 2 and up will have the opportunity to participate in the Archery Adventure as they discover the art of archery under the guidance of a skilled instructor.

Session 3 Sewing Bees around the World

Embark on a fun sewing adventure in this beginner class—no prior experience needed! Sewing not only adds an element of enjoyment but also enhances focus, eye-hand coordination, and the pincer grip. The class covers the basics, including understanding a sewing machine, proper threading, its functionality, and safety guidelines. Participants will also engage in hand embroidery.

This year's theme is "Stitching Around the World." First stop: the San Blas Islands of Panama, exploring the traditional Mola technique to craft a pillow. Next, venture to Africa to discover fabric printing using a wax resist method, creating a unique fabric for an eco-friendly shopping bag. Finally, travel to Japan to learn the centuries-old Sashiko hand sewing technique, crafting

a wall hanging and incorporating applique with the sewing machine. Join us for a creative and educational journey through the art of sewing!



Come join us for a fun week of learning how to code. This is a camp for children of all ages and levels of experience. We will begin the week by learning about block coding as we explore several different types of robots including Tello drones, Kibo Robots, and Photon. As the week progresses, we will move into scratch-based coding as we work with Sphero bits and the RVR robots to create programs that allow the robots to navigate a maze and complete a task. Children that have previous coding experience will also have the opportunity to use Scratch to create many different fun activities including coding their own videogame.


<u>Session 5</u> Exploring Modern Music History
